The Facts on Sexually Transmitted Diseases (STDs)

STD Facts:

Almost 50% of new STD transmissions happen in 15- to 24-year-olds.

Bacterial STDs, like gonorrhea and chlamydia, can be cured with treatment. Viral STDs, like HPV and herpes, cannot be cured, but symptoms are not always present.

Medication for bacterial STDs only works when:

- Medication is taken as prescribed
- Person abstains from sexual activity with the partner who transmitted the STD





Something to talk about:

- Discuss the short-term and long-term consequences of getting an STD.
- Discuss how to avoid transmitting STDs.

Most STDs do not have symptoms. If your teen has been sexually active, they need to get tested regularly.
